Physical development

- Can accurately count to find out how many things they have, up to and beyond 10.
- Can subitise up to 5 in regular and irregular arrangements.

Topic: Ready, Set, Grow

Topic starter

Arrival of live caterpillars

The very hungry caterpillar story arrives in Reception with a mystery box. What could be inside the box? We read the story and talk about how the caterpillars have grown. What will happen next? Open the box to find the live caterpillars. Children make observations and predict what they think will happen over the next two weeks.
