Follow Our Lead campaign

Durham County Council has implemented a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) for dog control. The new dog control measures mean that from 1 June all dog owners must:

- pick up after their dog and dispose of dog waste appropriately
- not allow dogs to stray – this means wander loose/roam or exercise without a responsible dog owner present
- not allow dogs into designated fenced off play areas included in the new Order
- put their dog on a lead when asked to do so by an authorised officer.

If dog owners fail to follow the new rules, they will be issued with a £100 Fixed Penalty Notice. The council's #FollowOurLead campaign will communicate the new dog control measures to dog owners. Stickers will be placed on lamp posts and dog/litter waste bins to remind dog owners to be responsible and pick up dog foul. Signage is also installed at every fenced off play area included in the new Order advising that dogs are not allowed to enter fenced off play areas. This is for the health and safety of children and protect them from the dog and foul.

E-Safety

Snapchat has developed a new feature called Snapmaps which allows users to see the location of other users of snapchat. There are three possible settings, sharing with no-one (Ghost Mode), sharing with select friends (Chose which friends you share your location with) and my friends (Share your location with all your friends). Many children have a large number of "friends" on their accounts who they probably do not know well, and could be accidentally sharing their location. The minimum age requirement for Snapchat is 13+ . Those between the ages of 13 and 17 are required to have parent consent and those under 13 should be directed to the more child friendly "Snapkidz" app.

We encourage parents to check their child's use of this App and privacy settings for older siblings - if they allow their child to use Snapchat.

Some schools have reported safety issues to the County E-safety team involving the game Roblox. As we take E-safety seriously we wish to share the new advice from the UK Safer Internet Centre with parents.

Childnet Education Officer Tom offers some top tips for parents to help young people stay safe of Roblox.

Young people and parents often mention Roblox. Young people regularly tell us how much they enjoy the different games and levels within it. The blog explains a bit about Roblox, what to be aware of as a parent and offers our (Childnet's) top tips on how to ensure your child stays safe. This is will include:

Communication: how Roblox can be used to communicate with other users

Content: what content is available on Roblox that might not be suitable for children

Costs: what ways children might accidentally run up costs while using Roblox
